KEY HAZARD AND RISK CONTROLS - Safety, Environment and General

Safety

- Avoid exposure of skin and mucous membrane to blood and bodily fluids
- Use appropriate safety signage at access points to area
- Always wear PPE and ensure it is in good condition
- Always wash hands before, after contact, and on removal of PPE

Environment

- Keep chemical use to a minimum
- Waste solution to be disposed of in sewage (toilet of cleaners sink)

General

- Wash equipment and allow to dry afterwards
- Use yellow colour coded cleaning equipment

STEP BY STEP GUIDE

Pre-Operation

- Collect all equipment required from cleaner's storage area or cleaner's trolley
- Check condition of equipment for any damage or faults
- Review SDS of any chemicals to be used
- Cover any cuts/abrasions on hands
- Wash hands and apply all required PPE and make sure it is in good working condition
- Place safety signage at all access points to notify other persons of task (or communicate if a spill)

Instructions

- If safe to do so, carefully remove/deal with any hazards that may have caused the spill (e.g., remove sharps with they caused wound)
- Contain the spill by using paper towels or disposable absorbent material (e.g., spill kit) around the edge of spill, then working inwards **DO NOT** use chemicals at this stage. **DO NOT** walk or kneel in any bodily Fluids
- If necessary, use a cardboard scraper (or dustpan) to remove solid material and place in a double bagged disposable bag
- Use paper/absorbent towel to soak up fluids. If applicable throw water over affect area to remove bodily fluids
- Clean area with warm water and diluted cleaning solution. Clean the surface area thoroughly with diluted bleach (or approved solution) and allow to air dry
- For small spills (spots of blood on tiles) an alcohol wipe may be enough
- If the spill is on carpet, clean thoroughly with warm water and cleaning solution and arrange for carpet to be shampooed with an industrial cleaner as soon as possible

Finishing Up

- Dispose of contaminated waste (e.g., dressings, wipes, cleaning cloths, tissues/paper towels, human tissue, and blood) in disposable bags (double bagged)
- Have any disposable items used from the spill kit replaced after clean-up
- Clean equipment, once dry return cleaners' area
- Wash hands, remove, and dispose of any PPE, and wash hands again

EMERGENCY REQUIREMENTS

• Be aware of site emergency response provisions and first aid requirements

FINAL CHECK

- Are all work areas clean and tidy?
- Have you put all equipment and materials away neatly?
- Have you reported any near misses or incidents?
