KEY HAZARD AND RISK CONTROLS - Safety, Environment and General

Safety

- Ensure correct PPE is worn when using chemicals
- Avoid awkward or comfortable postures, move feet

Environment

- Keep chemical use to a minimum
- Waste solution to be disposed of in sewage (toilet of cleaners sink)

General

Clean equipment and dry after use

STEP BY STEP GUIDE

Pre-Operation

- Collect all equipment required from cleaner's storage area or cleaner's trolley
- Check condition of equipment for any damage or faults
- Review SDS of any chemicals to be used
- Wash hands and apply all required PPE, making sure it is in good working condition

Instructions

- Use scraper to remove thick or sticky soils and wipe up residue with a dry or moistened cloth
- Use cloth to pick up dry, loose soils, then pour a little water onto the stain and blot up the liquid using a paper towel. For substantial liquid spills blot up as much as possible with absorbent material and then wipe with nominated cloth
- Always use the simplest methods first. Most spills can be removed with water or a mixture of a recommended remover and water. Always try the solution on a small area first
- Always work in a circular motion, starting outside the stain and working inwards
- Apply the solutions onto the surface stain directly unless it is dry cleaning solution this should be put on the cloth and then gently applied to the surface area
- After removing spot or stain, sponge the area with clean water and blot as dry as possible with absorbent material
- Brush the carpet pile in the same direction as the rest of the carpet
- Dry as much as possible using a paper towel and rolled up dry cloth. Cover the damp area with a piece of furniture to prevent it being walked on
- When the origin of the stain or spillage is known, consult list of recommended materials to be used for the liquid or substance concerned

Finishing Up

- Stubborn stains should be reported
- Wash and rinse all equipment used

EMERGENCY REQUIREMENTS

• Be aware of site emergency response provisions and first aid requirements

FINAL CHECK

- Are all work areas clean and tidy?
- Have you put all equipment and materials away neatly?
- Have you reported any near misses or incidents?
