KEY HAZARD AND RISK CONTROLS – Safety, Environment and General

Safety

- Do not use vacuum if cord is damaged or a current electrical test tag is not present
- Do not move any objects that are too heavy for you to move
- Avoid awkward postures by moving feet
- Take regular breaks

Environment

• Collect any waste prior to vacuuming – separating any recyclable materials

General

- Ensure area that is to be vacuumed is clear of any obstacles, including people
- Store vacuum on shelf or above ground level in cleaner's room
- Check condition of vacuum prior to starting for any damage

STEP BY STEP GUIDE

Pre-Operation

- Collect all equipment required from cleaner's storage area or cleaner's trolley
- Check condition of equipment for any damage or faults and current test and tag
- Apply any PPE and make sure it is in good working condition
- Ensure area to be vacuumed is clear of any obstructions
- Assess the safety of the material to be vacuumed sweeping may more suitable
- Use portable RCD

Instructions

- Adjust the length of the wand so that the hand piece is parallel with the ground when you hold it with you back straight
- Stand upright and avoid bending forward
- Move the legs and not the back
- · Make sure you use the correct attachment and vacuum the area in overlapping strokes using easy underarm motions
- Aim to vacuum from the power point doing one side area as you go and then doing the other side as you make your way back to the power point
- Move any light obstructions (such a furniture in your way), but do not move any objects that are too heavy for you to move
- When vacuuming under low furniture/equipment (ideally using the small brush attachment) do get down on one knee rather than bending over. Do place your spare hand on the furniture/equipment for improved balance
- If the carpet is stained, remove stains using an appropriate spot cleaner after vacuuming

Finishing Up

- Empty and dispose of any waste correctly
- Remove any entangled objects from the vacuum brush
- Clean filters are every use
- Wind cord properly, starting at machine and coiling cord towards the unplugged end to reduce twisting of the cord
- Store vacuum in cleaner's area, ensuring walkways are free

EMERGENCY REQUIREMENTS

• Be aware of site emergency response provisions and first aid requirements

FINAL CHECK

- Are all work areas clean and tidy?
- Have you put all equipment and materials away neatly?
- Have you reported any near misses or incidents?
